
Heraldry for Self-Isolators—Week 2

Monday 6th April 2020—the 700th anniversary of the Declaration of Arbroath

Today we are going to look at the coats of arms of some of the nobles whose seals are attached to the Declaration of Arbroath, sealed on this day in 1320.



The King, Robert I, did not attach his seal to the Declaration but wrote to the Pope separately.

We saw the Royal Arms of Scotland last week—the lion rampant has a "double tressure" - or double frame round it; it is "flory" - decorated with lilies on the outside and "counterflory", also decorated on the inside,






Or a lion rampant within a double-tressure flory-counter-flory Gules.

The text suggests that there were more than fifty seals attached to the original Declaration, sent to the Pope at Avignon. The contemporary copy held at the National Records Of Scotland has only nineteen. A selection of the coats of arms of some of the owners of the seals appears for you to colour in on page 2, with the coloured versions for you to compare




